 - No alternative options/routes, only mitigation along route




Common threads - EIA and SEA

 - E.g. Cumulative effects




- Projects dictating plans
- Levers for environmental advocates to seek accountability



Changing paradigms, changing purposes and the future?



Framing EA through accountability....?

- Information taken into account
 - Informs decision maker
- Impact assessment:
 - can help make better decisions
 - doesn't make the decision for you
- Effective if more sustainable decisions?

- Platform for
 - Transparency and openness
 - Accountability and legitimacy
 - Voice
- Supported by other drivers
 - May conflict with speeding up planning.....
- **But,** even poor EA can promote accountability

Conclusions: the practical challenges

- Speeding up decision making destined to fail:
 - Ignores the purpose of the process
 - Controversial schemes take a long time because they are controversial
- Quality of process/assessment
 - Tiering of SEA and EIA
- Openness to other knowledge
 - EA could open up strategic debates,
 e.g. role of high speed rail; mix of energy technologies etc.
- New research agenda
