EIA Directive: Main Changes

- Screening: Thorough Reports + Design & Mitigation
- Streamlining: Linking EIA and HRA
- New Topics: Health, CC, Biodiversity, Resource use
- Alternatives: Reasonable Alt & incl: iterative design
- Experts: EIA led & ES reviewed by competent experts
- Mitigation: Ensure implemented by developer
- Monitoring: Mandatory for significant negative effects



- Monitoring: COM1 A and COM5 C









Pass Rate for Climatic Factors - UK EIA








