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
The actors

- All three interact with respect to practitioner integrity.



Environmental and social impact

- Provides information for a decision
- It is not the decision document itself

The project 2. Economic benefit/cost 1. Technical feasibility

The end result is supposed to be better projects

Not just better environmental impact statements and management plans

IA Integrity issues

• Response to corrupt sponsor/client, contractor, supervisor


- No easy answer
- Try to persuade the sponsor/client
- Don't let your name get associated with a faulty EIA.
 - Short run, lose the assignment, contract, or job
 - Long run, your reputation is what will matter
- Consequences either way

Objectivity

- What is it?
- Judgment, that is
 - based on observable phenomena
 - uninfluenced by emotions or personal prejudices

Objectivity

- What good is it?
 - Better project gets you on the proponent's side; gets the proponent on your side.
 - Educates the proponent or client on the need for full consideration of sustainability to the other components to the success of the project,
 - Don't be afraid to change project during EIA
 - The main lesson for the sponsor/client: A bad EIA can result in a bad, more costly, delayed, or cancelled project.
 - A better project is what EIA is supposed to be about:



From George's intro:

• "If an EA, and those who prepare it, do not meet these and other important qualifications then the public...may not have confidence that the assessment is adequate, complete, objective and responsive to the public interest, or, worse, that the EA reflects biased and poorly informed information to be dismissed. Lack of such confidence can result in unfavourable outcomes for proponents..."

What does it mean for IA Practitioner integrity?

• Recognize the validity of the proponent's goals for the project as well as concerns of the other stakeholders.

 Recognize the validity of the other components of the project evaluation process – the 3-legged stool

 Recognize the place of environmental and social sustainability in the whole project context, and the need for strict objectivity

Presentation methods
