Independent Consultation and Investigation Mechanism (MICI)

- Triggered by project affected communities.
 - Scope of action: social and environmental issues.
- Offers Dispute Resolution and Investigation.

Indigenous Peoples issues seen in complaints to MICI

- Inadequate characterization of the directly affected population as indigenous peoples.
- **Consultations** that lacked meaningfulness, participation, and representativity of all stakeholders.
- When communities are divided, the review of the risk of social conflict or conflict escalation has been insufficient.
- Lack of adequately assessing the project operator's capacity to manage social risks
- Lack of conflict resolution systems to properly manage land disputes.

Some lessons learned from MICI's interventions

Meaningful stakeholder engagement requires timely, accessibility, and culturally appropriate consultations and information disclosure.

Stronger focus on social issues.

Proactive efforts are needed to systematically identify contextual risk and prevent projects from contributing or exacerbating social conflict.

Correctly assessing cultural identity, customs, and integrity of local communities and indigenous peoples is fundamental to ensuring **appropriate measures** to mitigate impacts to cultural integrity.

Project teams need to **systematically disclose** all the project-related documents and supplemental studies in a timely manner.
