- Increase the productive years

OHS Issues during initial years of the Rural Road Project implementation

- Lack of awareness on OHS
- Labourers not provided with PPE
- Labourers hesitant to use PPE
- Very Poor conditions of labor camps
- No record Keeping system of labor presence
- No injury log
- No Monitoring/supervision for OHS
- No clear provisions/cost included in Bidding and Contract documents
- No formal orientation/awareness program

Working without PPE / No attention to Community and Health









How were the issues addressed?

- Policy reforms
- Amendment of Contractual provisions
- Training, awareness program
- Strengthening the capacity
- Monitoring and enforcement
- Decent job creation (green jobs)






Routine Maintenance Group (RMG)

The maintenance component of this rural transport project was a vehicle to:

- Raised awareness on OHS
- ► Improved rural men and women's employability and economic empowerment,
- ► Enhanced access to financial services in rural areas
- ► Maintained the quality of rural roads through the use of labour based intensive work methods
- ► Imparted technical skills to local people to green the rural road/infrastructure
- ► Sustainable use of local resources
- Prevented injuries leading to more productivity and long-term benefits
