SOCIAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT (SIA) IN URBAN RENEWAL PROJECT

IMPLEMENTATION IN SARAWAK.

**Abstract** 

The landscape of development in Sarawak, particularly in towns and cities has

changed significantly due to rapid urban population growth. This has eventually

led to urban sprawl, which drives the occupation of land by squatters and rural

migrants which resulted in overcrowded villages and dense settlements in

major cities in Sarawak such as Kuching, Sibu, Bintulu and Miri. Therefore,

Government of Sarawak through Ministry of Urban Development & Natural

Resources (MUDeNR) has introduced and implemented the State Urban

Renewal Implementation Guidelines (SURIG) in year 2018 for all approved

urban renewal projects. SURIG has outlined five (5) main objectives of urban

renewal as follows:

(i) Uplift the physical and social well-being of the communities;

(ii) Provide conducive, safe, healthy and orderly development;

(iii) Increase the income of the communities through creation of new job and

business opportunities;

(iv) Generate wealth for the property owners and future generation; and

Provide affordable and quality housing for both the property owners and (v)

their extended families.

It was highlighted in SURIG that urban renewal shall be carried out with

emphasize not only on the physical aspects but also on the social, livelihood

and economic elements that can help to improve standard of living as well as

generate economic, business and employment opportunities. A "People First, Public Participatory" approach should be adopted too. The requirement to conduct Social Impact Assessment (SIA) Study is a compulsory by SURIG before the physical development of urban renewal projects. The SIA Study is a vital stage to identify and assess significant social variables and develop a comprehensive mitigating measure towards the betterment and sustainability of their quality of life. The pioneer urban renewal project is Darul Hana Redevelopment Project which is occupies an area of 722 acres and involve twelve (12) villages with approximately 4,500 families. The SIA Study of Darul Hana Redevelopment Project was conducted in year 2018.
