Scoping.... Current *v/s* Proposed Liquor Licensing Policy

- On-licenses in Nonresidential area– No restrictions
- On-licenses in residential area 8am to 1am max
- Off-licenses Nonresidential– No restrictions
- Off-licenses in residential areas 9am to 12midnight max

- On-licenses 8am to 1am max (residential and non residential)
- Off-licenses 8am to 8am or 8am to 10pm
- CBD on-licenses 8 am to 1am or 8 am to 3am with a one-way door policy from 1am
- Clubs 8 am to 1 am max
