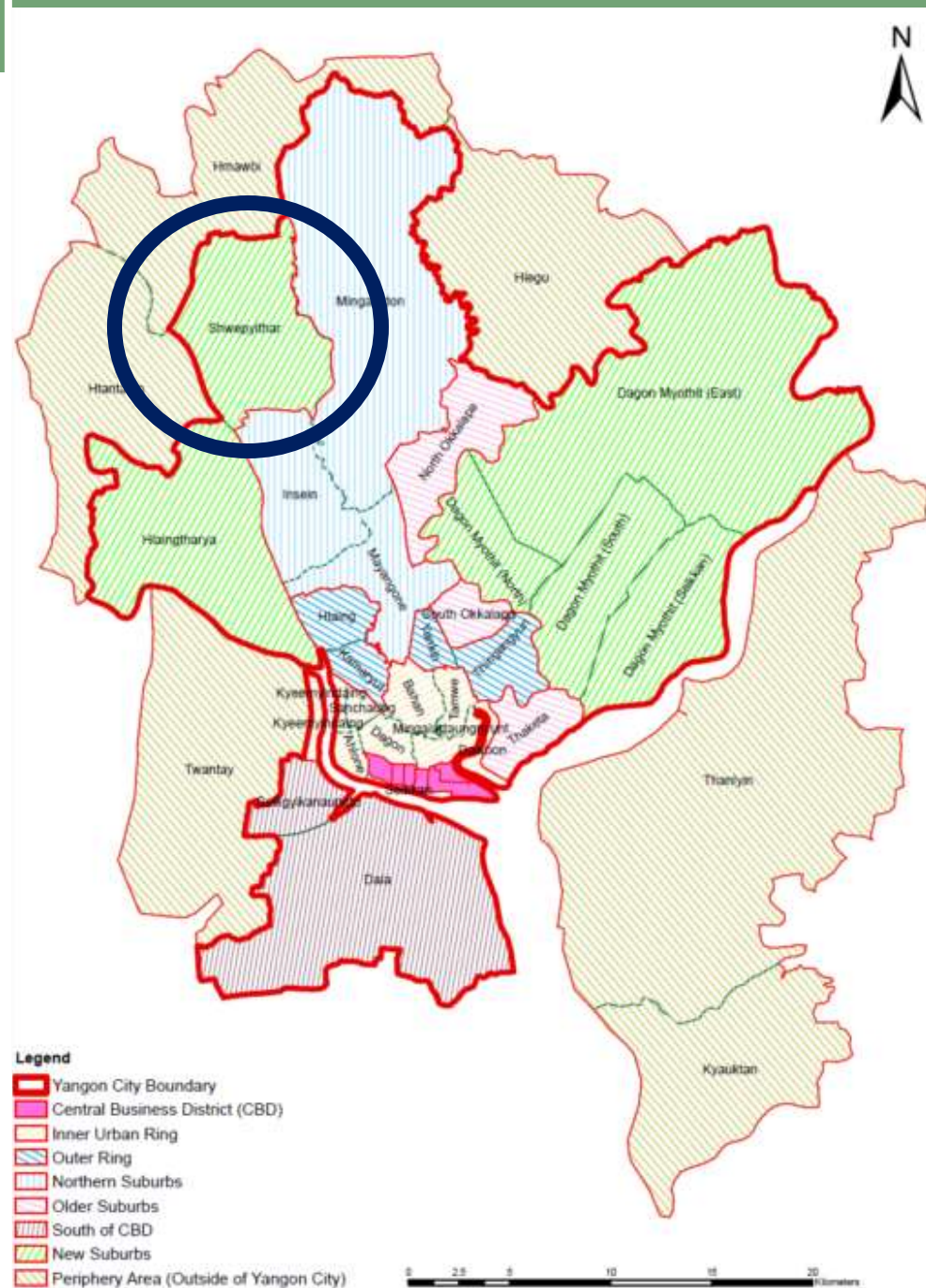

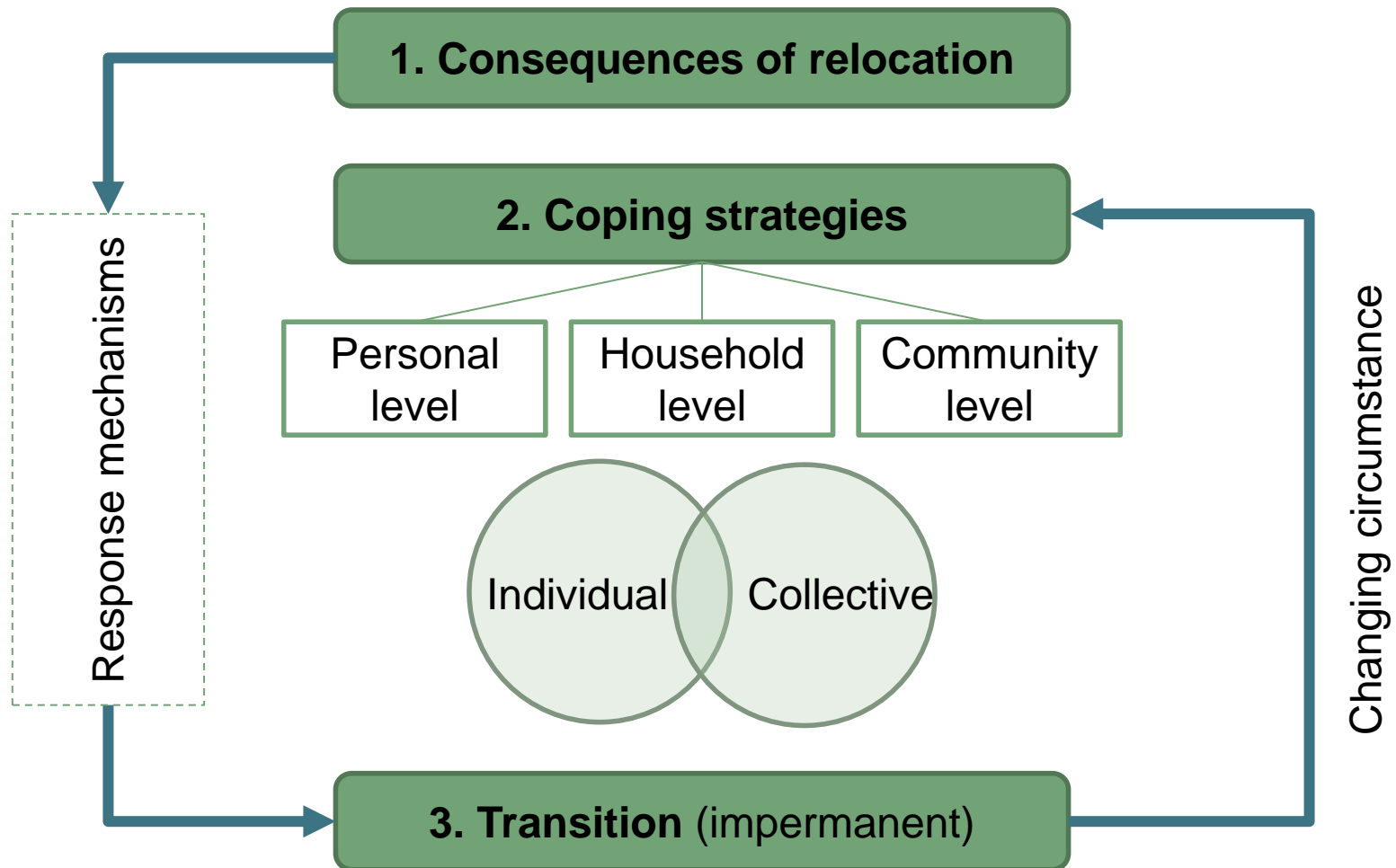
Application

Preliminary findings

- Ongoing impacts
- Coping strategies
 - Personal = new skills, diversifying livelihoods
 - Household = increasing capital
 - Community = donations
- Self-governance and collective action
 - Support network within community
 - Religious guidance
- Individual action
 - Livelihoods
 - Leadership – community benefits
- Transitioning
 - Impermanent
